Priority 2	Continue to employ a school counsellor to work with vulnerable children who have mental health and emotional issues.

Barriers to learning these priorities address	We know that the main barriers to educational achievement are social deprivation, high % of one parent families and non-working backgrounds
Projected spending	£100,000 (mainly staffing)

Progress in Reading	For lowest 20% of readers to achieve at least national expectations in KS2 results.	July 2024
Progress in Writing	Achieve at least national expectations in KS2 results.	July 2024
Progress in Mathematics	For lowest 20% of learners to achieve at least national expectations in KS2 results.	July 2024
Phonics	Achieve at least national expectations in Y1 results.	June 2024

### Targeted academic support for current academic year

Priority 1	Use of Oxford Owl Read, Write, Inc resources for reception and KS1 to improve phonics knowledge.
Priority 2	Establish small group interventions for disadvantaged pupils falling below age-related expectations.
Barriers to learning these priorities address	Encouraging wider reading through new books, clubs and competitions
Projected spending	£90,000 (mainly staffing)

### Wider strategies for current academic year

Measure	Activity
Priority 1	Continue to develop the Rainbow room so that it is nurturing and can cater for children with specific needs, in particular children with autism, so that all are part of an inclusive curriculum
Priority 2	Creating performing arts club once again to develop confidence and build self-esteem.

Barriers to learning these priorities address	Improving attendance and readiness to learn for the most disadvantaged pupils
